Premises Update



Welcome Back to the new school year - As mentioned by Mr Murphy we have been extremely busy over the summer period ensuring the school premises were clean and tidy for the children's return in September and I'd like to thank all the premises staff for their hard work. We have had various works going on throughout the break, but nothing quite as significant as the new roof on the Linkway which connects KS1 and KS2.

This has allowed the area to remain much cooler during the hot days and warmer during the winter months when the temperature drops.

This is part of a commitment by Haringey to upgrade various schools across the borough.

They are also completing some important fire upgrades to the internal building which is due for completion in October.

As part of our own commitment to ensuring the learning environment for the children is of the highest it can possibly be we have carried out works identified to achieve this.



This included a new cooking island located in the main staffroom to encourage healthy eating and is something the school feels will benefit the children by giving them a space to learn and practice in.



The KS2 garden is currently undergoing a renovation due to be completed in the new few weeks. Green space in an urban environment is a luxury that we making the most of and this garden will encourage the children to learn about wildlife and give an outdoor learning space they can make the most of.

Bikes and Scooters on the School Premises

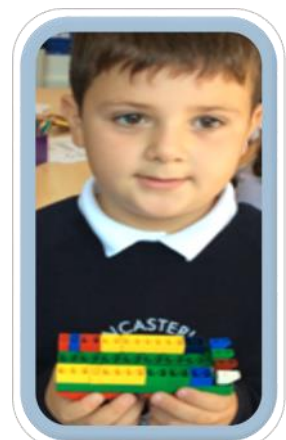
