Parent Class Representative needed

The Parent Representative will have a role in maintaining good communication between parents, while also being a valuable resource to the teacher and the class. The class reps can also facilitate the social interaction among families in the school community.

What is a parent representative ?

The parent representative liaises with other parents of the class by keeping them informed of activities, events and key information.
The parent representative is a "support resource" for times when the teacher may request additional support.

What specifically does a parent representative do for the parents ?

The parent representative supports the PSA to encourage other parents to volunteer when needed – either for activities and events when needed by the class teacher.
The parent representative acts as the communication mediator between parents and the class teacher.

What specifically does a parent representative do for the teachers ?

The parent representative, at the request of the teacher arranges parent assistance from other parents for a specific class activity or event.

What specifically does a parent representative not do ?

Class representatives are not to be used to help other parents express concerns about their own children. This should be done directly between the parents themselves and the teacher.

What forms of communication may be required from the Parent representative ?

The parent representative will encourage other parents to support with school and class events. This includes helping with organising class parties and events, helping with practical class activities or helping with class assemblies

If this is something you would like to do please register your interest with the main school office by **Friday 15th November.**

If there is more than one parent registers their interests per class a class vote will take place.



Tuesday 13th November will be our 3rd annual ODD SOCKS DAY.

Starting Primary School in 2020 – Reception Admissions

If your child was born between **01/09/2015 and 31/08/2016** you will need to apply for a reception school place for September 2020

You must submit your application by 15 January 2020

Any applications received after 15/01/2020 will be processed after those who applied on-time, causing families to potentially miss out on a place for their preferred school.

If you are not able to apply online, please contact [school admissions](#) to request a paper form however there must be a legitimate reason for you not applying online. This form must reach school admission team by **15/01/2020**.

Food in School Reminder

As you know, the safety of your children is our number one priority and, as such, we have strict rules in place in relation to external food sources coming into the school. This is to ensure the safety of the increasing number of children at the school who have severe allergies. We have consulted with our school health worker, other local heads and a parent of children with severe allergies in order to devise the following measures:

- Children are only allowed to bring in non-edible party gifts/bags on their birthdays (e.g. Poundshop gifts, stationery, pens, pencils, etc.). All food gifts/cakes will be turned away/returned to the parent.
- The school will provide a list of specific items which can be brought in for end of term parties/celebrations. This will be shared with parents and will be used by staff to check items brought in; any items not on the list will be rejected.

Healthy lunch box requirements continue, but no nuts are allowed. Please speak to your children about not swapping food with friends at school.

We will also:

- Ensure staff don't use food as treats in class at any time.
- Ensure that staff who lead cookery lessons take specific care to ensure that they are free of possible allergens.
- Schedule a monthly mention in assemblies re. no swapping of food in the dining hall.

Raise awareness of allergy management in classes with children and teachers, including the need for staff to speak to our Welfare Officer (Veronica) immediately if a child is exposed to an allergen.

Thank you in advance for your support with this; I am sure that you will agree that children's safety is paramount.

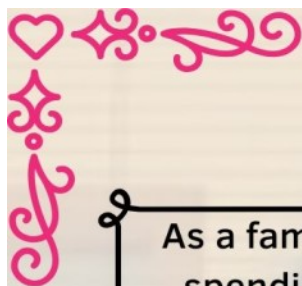
Help paying for your childcare

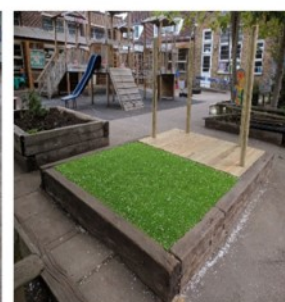
