School Finances



We are writing to inform you about the current financial difficulties faced by Lancasterian Primary and many other schools across the country.



You may be aware of the recent announcements from the government that more money is going into the national education budget. Whilst it is true that schools are being promised increases in funding over the next 3 years, these headlines mask the reality that many will still be in a position of financial difficultly due to cuts in real-terms funding over previous years and escalating costs.

Lancasterian Primary, like many other Haringey schools, is now facing the possibility of having to run a licensed deficit budget next year, meaning that we will effectively run into agreed debt with the local authority. The impact of this will be that we will have to find ways to make further savings over the next few years in order to get 'out of the red', in spite of having already taken such measures including a full support staff restructure. Obviously, the children's education and well-being will drive all our decisions as always, but we may be forced to make some tough choices regarding staffing, resourcing and ongoing development of the school facilities. Staff and governors are working hard with external parties to ensure that our school is running as efficiently as possible.

What can you do to help?

- Money is allocated to schools on a 'per pupil' basis; in other words, the more children we have at the school, the more money we get. Please spread the good word about the school to any families who are looking for school places for their children – this is by far the biggest impact you can have as parents/carers.
- 2) Ensure that you have registered at the school for free school meals if you are eligible this brings in additional funding to the school.
- 3) Your participation in school fundraising events is always appreciated.
- 4) Parents/carers who are able to give time to join the PSA in organising fund-raising events are very welcome.
- 5) Any parents/carers who are looking for volunteer opportunities should speak to our reception teacher, Jannine; volunteers can provide important additional support to children who have additional needs but do not qualify for extra funding.
- 6) In the upcoming elections, look carefully at what the different parties are promising in terms of education funding, and take this into account when choosing how to vote.

Thanks for your ongoing support for the school and we will continue to keep you posted.

TikTok is a video-sharing app. Users can upload and share short videos of themselves lipsyncing to songs or acting out comedy sketches, and add special effects.

They can gain followers ('fans') and browse other people's videos.

If your child previously had a Musical.ly account they will be able to access their content on TikTok. The age recommendation for using this app is 13 and above; However, you don't have to prove your age when creating an account, so younger children can still use it easily and is most popular with under-16s.

TikTok is free to download on Android and iOS devices (Apple phones and tablets). It carries ads and offers in-app purchases. It currently has about 150 million active users worldwide and is available in over 30 languages.

Starting Primary School in 2020 – Reception Admissions

If your child was born between 01/09/2015 and 31/08/2016 you will need to apply for a reception school place for September

2020

You must submit your application by 15 January 2020

Any applications received after 15/01/2020 will be processed after those who applied on-time, causing families to potentially miss out on a place for their preferred school.

If you are not able to apply online, please contact <u>school admissions</u> to request a paper form however there must be a legitimate reason for you not applying online. This form must reach school admission team by **15/01/2020.**
