Updated Isolation Rules

Following the government's recent announcement about the relaxation of COVID measures nationally, and given the reduction of cases we have seen in school, we have taken a proactive but cautious approach to updating our COVID Management Plan. The full plan and risk assessment can be found on our website at www.lancasterianprimary.co.uk/key-information/coronavirus-return-to-school-and-recovery-plan but here are a few highlights:

- Year group bubbles will remain in place, although these will be generally more relaxed and crossover can occur under the circumstances outlined in the plan.
- Cleaning, hand-hygiene and ventilation arrangements remain largely unchanged.
- Our approach to managing suspected (with symptoms) or confirmed cases of Coronavirus has not changed (i.e. they must isolate). However, this is likely to be reviewed on 1/4/22 when testing is due to end nationally.
- Routine contact tracing in school has now ended. All staff, children and young people – including unvaccinated adults – who are NOT suspected or confirmed cases should attend their education settings as usual. This includes children and staff who have been in close contact with a positive case either at school or at home except in the unlikely event that they have been instructed to quarantine by the NHS. There will be no more COVID case notifications through Parenthub.
- Staff are no longer required to test at home twice weekly during full school opening.
- Monday assemblies will continue to be carried out in classrooms via Zoom for convenience; Friday praise assemblies will be in the halls (KS1 for Y1-3, K2 for Y4-6). Parents/carers will not yet be invited into assemblies and there will be no class assemblies to maximise time for catch-up.
- Before and after school club operations will return to pre-pandemic arrangements; children can mix across bubbles.
