Improved KS1/2 Curriculum

We have been working hard on improving our KS1/2 curriculum over the past term to ensure that we are fully meeting – and often exceeding – the demands of the National Curriculum. This has been undertaken particularly in relation the foundation subjects (i.e. all subjects apart from English, maths and science) in collaboration with Haringey Education Partnership and other schools across Haringey. At Lancasterian Primary, we believe that our foundation curriculum should enable our children to understand and achieve well in multiple disciplines. Our intention is to give our children the cultural capital they need to eradicate inequalities and be successful in life.

Each foundation subject curriculum and its associated teaching approaches secure the highest possible quality of education for pupils through four closely related curricular attributes – scope, rigour, coherence and sequencing. These four attributes are the means and measure of strong curricula because they ensure that the subject properly reflects academic practices in the world beyond primary education. They ensure that the curriculum is organised in the best way to allow pupils to make progress and to thrive in each subject.

Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic (BAME) achievement and climate change run as threads throughout and across subjects as we feel that these are important topics which are relevant to Lancasterian Primary School children's lives now and for their future. The Lancs Approach to Learning is embedded within this new curriculum framework.

From January onwards, we will teach most foundation subjects through a 'blocked' approach; this means that most subjects are taught in 1 - 3-week blocks across each term, ensuring that enough time is given to meet and exceed the demands of the National Curriculum. Most of the curriculum maps have already been uploaded, with a few more to follow in January once final tweaks have been completed.


Exciting News - KS1 Garden!

Starting Primary School in 2020 - Reception Admissions

If your child was born between **01/09/2015 and 31/08/2016** you will need to apply for a reception school place for September 2020

You must submit your application by 15 January 2020

Any applications received after 15/01/2020 will be processed after those who applied on-time, causing families to potentially miss out on a place for their preferred school.

If you are not able to apply online, please contact <u>school admissions</u> to request a paper form however there must be a legitimate reason for you not applying online. This form must reach school admission team by **15/01/2020**.
