Pupil and Staff Absences

You will have no doubt seen how pupil and staff attendance is being impacted by Coronavirus at present; we wish all those who are unwell a speedy recovery and return to school. Thank you to all parents/carers for your support and cooperation in testing your children and keeping them off school if they have symptoms or have tested positive — by working together we can keep the spread of infection to a minimum. We will continue to inform you via Parenthub when we have cases, in the interests of remaining transparent and enabling you to have a full picture of the current situation. As you will have seen on the news, schools nationally are struggling with staffing during the current wave of COVID, and we are no exception. Luckily, we have a great team who are pulling together to continue to give a high quality of service to the children, but please do be patient with us as we grapple with high numbers of staff absences. We will do all we possible can to keep the children in school, and only ever use home learning as a very last resort.

Final Reminder for Reception Admissions!

The deadline to submit applications for Reception admissions is 15/01/2022. Please ensure that the applications are submitted promptly to avoid any disappointment. Any applications submitted after the 15/01/2022 will be considered after the applicants that have submitted on time.

Remote Education Expectations

For children who are isolating with Coronavirus (or Coronavirus symptoms) but feel well, please remember that they must complete remote education online using the resources available via The Oak National Academy, which caters for all primary pupils including those in the early years and with special needs. The Oak National Academy provides a bank of around 10,000 free, high-quality lessons and resources combining videos, quizzes and worksheets. Updated Isolation Rules

Please read very carefully as there are some subtle changes.

COVID Testing & Isolation Rules

Testing:

- It is no longer required to take a confirmatory PCR test following a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test
 result. Anyone who receives a positive LFD test result should self-isolate immediately. However, anyone
 with symptoms of COVID should still take a PCR test.
- Even if someone has tested positive for COVID within the last 90 days, they are still strongly encouraged
 to take part in routine LFD testing at home once they have completed their isolation period for their prior
 infection.

Isolation:

Self-isolation for confirmed Coronavirus cases has been reduced from 10 days to 7 days for children below the age of 18 years and 6 months and vaccinated adults, as long as LFD tests are used to check that the virus has cleared.

As such, if a child has a positive test outcome:

- they should **isolate for at least 7 days** from the onset of their symptoms the 10 day isolation period has been reduced to 7 days, unless you cannot test for any reason.
- they must take LFD tests on day 6 and day 7 of their isolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of isolation. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 6 of the isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart. If both these test results are negative, and they do not have a high temperature, they may end their isolation after the second negative test result and return to school. PLEASE NOTE: if the LFD tests are taken early morning and day 6 and day 7 and both are negative, your child can return to school on day 7. This also applies to children under 5, with testing at parent/carer discretion; if the parent/carer are unable to test the child, then they must complete the full 10 days of isolation.
 - if the LFD tests on day 6 or day 7 are positive, they must continue to isolate; **re-tests should be done on day 8 and day 9** and they can stop isolation on day 9 if both tests are negative and they do not have a high
 temperature.
 - if **no tests are taken, then a full 10 day isolation** period will need to be completed.
- Individuals should **not take any more LFD tests after the 10th day** of your isolation period and may stop self-isolating after this day. This is because they are unlikely to be infectious after the 10th day of the isolation period.
 - in all cases, staff and pupils can only return to school only if they do not have symptoms other than cough
 or loss of sense of smell/taste. This is because a cough or anosmia can last for several weeks once the infection has gone. If they still have a high temperature, they should keep self-isolating until their temperature returns to normal.
- if someone has tested positive whilst not experiencing symptoms but develops symptoms during isolation, they should **restart the isolation period** from the day they develop symptoms.
