

### **YUMU Music Learning Platform**



YUMU is Charanga Music's online learning platform for music. It is a valuable and fun resource for children to extend their music learning outside the classroom. It allows children to explore many different musical instruments, how they work, how to play them, the music language connected with them and if they are learning to play guitar, piano or violin, they can practice and learn new songs by themselves or in a group. Furthermore, there is a huge library of great songs in many different styles, along with vocal warm-ups, to help them improve their singing ability. They can also learn about many different styles and genres of music and learn some music history!

Before Christmas, the Key Stage 2 children received a welcome letter from YUMU, along with their login details and password. They have received tutorials from me about how to use the platform and all they have to do is follow this link <a href="https://haringeymusicdigital.org.uk/yumu">https://haringeymusicdigital.org.uk/yumu</a> and enter their username and password to start exploring.

Every half term, there will be a prize for the child in each year group who has collected the most virtual coins by exploring and learning.





















#### **Music Clubs**





All the lunchtime and after school music and performing arts clubs are up and running again.

It is now £5 a term for guitar, ukulele, samba drumming and breakfast club orchestra. The children in the Key Stage 2 guitar group and the Ukulele club will be performing at a music assembly after half term, to show their skills. We'll let you know a date when this is finalised.

If your child has been part of ukulele or guitar club for more than a term, we recommend that it's time to think about buying an inexpensive instrument for them. Already a few children have their own instruments and they are usually the ones making the most progress. For them to improve more rapidly, having their own instrument that they can practice on at home (with the aid of the YUMU beginners guitar and ukulele courses that we follow) is vital. Below are a few links to some inexpensive guitars and ukuleles you can go for. If you need advice on which size guitar to buy, I am happy to help.
