

Special Needs Transport Consultation

Haringey are holding a consultation for parents/ carers about Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) transport.

If you, like us, are concerned about the interaction between the SEND transport buses and Lancs/Vale families at the beginning and end of each day, then please do go along and express your views.

The head teacher, Paul, will attend to raise concerns but the more voices that are able to speak out, the more chance there is of changes being made.

Our hope is that the transport services may be able to either change the timing of the SEND buses so that they don't coincide with the start of the Lancs school day, or else provide someone to manage the flow of buses in and out of the car park.


Garden Club
