hours after their last incident of being sick or having

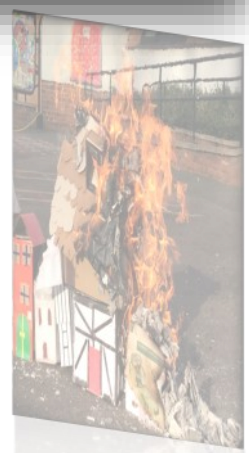
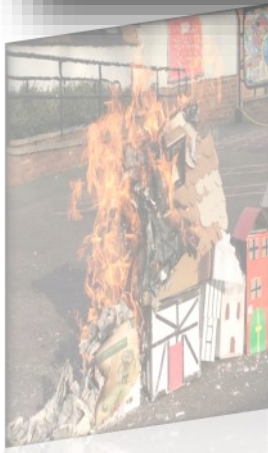
