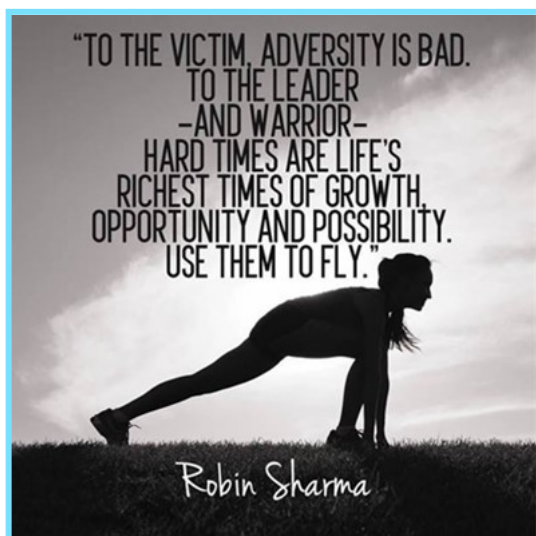

Welcome Back Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 Children
