All 25 years have been teaching here at Lancs.

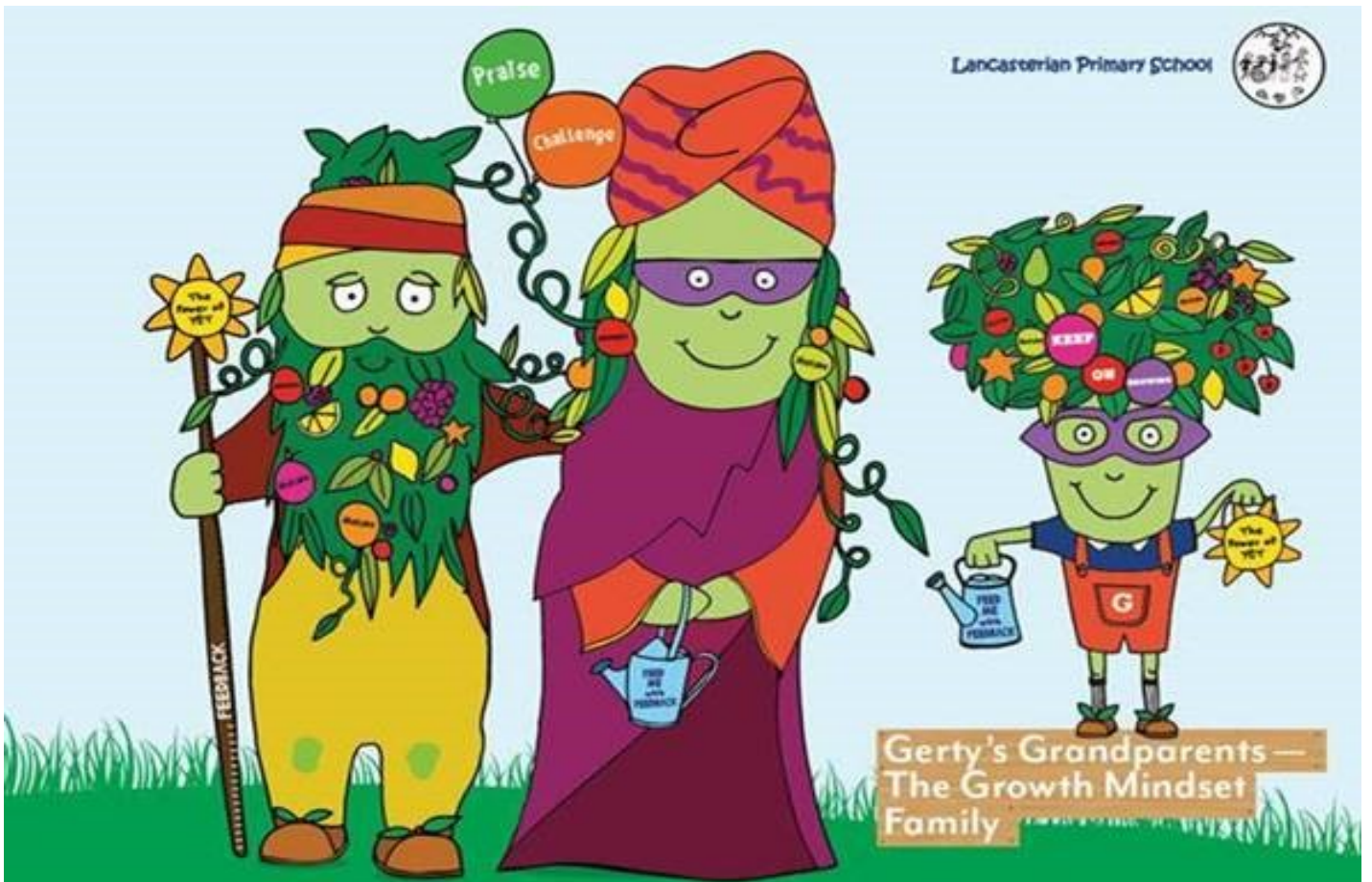
We are so proud of you Valentina.

Gerty's Grandparents — The Growth Mindset Family

Gerty lives with her grandparents and they bring her to Lancasterian Primary School because they want her to seek out and enjoy challenges.

When Gerty says she can't do something her grandparents remind her to say 'yet'! Grandpa's luminous torch reminds Gerty that when things get tough she should keep trying and never give up. They encourage Gerty to grow in her learning by radiating this 'Power of Yet'.

They remember the feedback they receive from the Lancasterian staff about Gerty's learning and sprinkle her with advice, help and support during their time together at home. Grandpa marks the feedback on the handle of his torch, so that they all remember Gerty's learning targets as they work together at home. They ask for extra help from school when they need it.

Just like Gerty, her grandparents are always learning too. Their magnificent branches and fruit have been developed over a lifetime of risk taking and being brave enough to go out of their comfort zones. Look at all their beautiful loops and branches! They've been formed by the mistakes they have made as parents and grandparents. They admit their mistakes and carry them with them so they grow in strength. This makes their school community grow stronger too.

Gerty's grandparents always remember to share their praise balloon with Gerty when she makes an effort. They also challenge her when she gives up.

Election of Parent Governor

We are excited to announce that there is a vacancy for a parent governor on the school governing body and we would love you to get in touch if you're interested in getting involved.

School governors play an important role in setting the overall direction of the school. We work with the head teacher and other school leaders to make sure the school is run as effectively as possible through overseeing major priorities like educational outcomes, finances, staffing and the safety and wellbeing of the children. The governing body is a mix of parents, staff and other people from the community. All parents, guardians and carers of pupils attending the school are eligible to stand to be governors.

Being a governor requires a commitment of time and effort. There are normally around 3 evening meetings to attend each term as well as papers to read in advance of meetings and other ad hoc duties from time to time. However, I assure you it is hugely fulfilling to get involved and make a contribution to our school community.

If you are happy to make this commitment and keen to work with us to shape the future of the school, we would love to hear from you. If you would like to have a chat about it before deciding whether to put yourself forward, please do not hesitate to come and speak to Mr. Murphy or me. If you ask the school office, they can put you in touch.

If you are interested in being a parent governor, please:

- Complete the nomination form which was sent home this week with children
- Get it countersigned by a proposer (another parent who is happy to support your nomination)
- Return it to the school office for the attention of Chair of Governors Anne Baxendale, **no later than 9.30am on Monday 11th October.**

If we have more than one nomination, then an election will be held. If that happens, candidates will be asked to provide a brief statement about themselves and then all parents will have the opportunity to vote.
