Happy New School Year!

A huge welcome back to all our children, and hello and welcome to all our new starters.

We had a fantastic first week back at school and the children have settled brilliantly. Behaviour for learning has been excellent this week, and it has been an absolute pleasure to walk around the school and see the children so engaged in their learning. As always, thanks to parents/carers for everything you do to support your children's positive attitudes to school and learning – team work makes the dream work!

Our 10 priority areas for improvement this year will be as follows:

- 1. Maintain robust curricular approaches and reintroduce rigorous intervention programmes to rapidly close gaps in learning caused by the pandemic, in particular ensuring children are ready to transition to the next key stage.
- 2. Increase the number of children working at greater depth.
- 3. Improve reading outcomes across the school with a particular focus on early reading, bringing phonics outcomes back on track and supporting those who are at risk of failing to read in key stage 2.
- 4. Return to previous high standards of writing following the difficulties that have been experienced in this area during lockdown.
- 5. Prioritise diminishing the difference for children with special educational needs and priority Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic (BAME) groups.
- 6. Further develop the school's approach to Modern Foreign Languages and PE to ensure full consistency.
- 7. Ensure children are actively engaged in all lessons by implementing further assessment for learning tools and strategies.
- 8. Continue to work on reducing persistent absenteeism and improving punctuality.
- 9. Work to achieve financial sustainability by effectively implementing strategies to raise pupil numbers, including improvements in marketing.
- 10. Ensure that the health and safety of children and staff remains a key factor in all decisions taken in relation to school provision, staffing, etc. by continuing to follow guidance from the government, Public Health, Haringey HR, HEP and the unions and by listening to all stakeholders.

We look forward to continuing to work closely with you on these key priorities in the year ahead.
