
- 1. Improve Y6 SATs results, especially in reading.



## **Hidden Needs Parents/Carers Working Group**



Our next meeting will be Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> November, 9am – 10am at the school. All parents/carers are welcome to attend, whether or not they have attended before. The group brings together parents/carers, staff and other professionals to support children with hidden needs to thrive both at school and at home, by enabling the adults around them to better understand their needs and use the right approaches and resources. "Hidden Needs", which may include neurodiversity, describes the idea that people experience and interact with the world around them in many different ways; there is no one "right" way of thinking, learning, and behaving, and differences are not viewed as deficits.

# **Bikes and Scooters in the Playgrounds**

For safety reasons, the rules for bikes and scooters in playgrounds at the start and the end of the day is as follows:

- Bikes cannot be ridden at any time in the playground; they must be walked to the exits.
- Scooters can be ridden as long as this is done sensibly and speed is not excessive.

Please could you help us to enforce this with your children.



### **Bed Bugs – Information from the NHS**

Bedbugs are small insects that often live on furniture or bedding. Their bites can be itchy, but do not usually cause other health problems.



Bedbugs can be dark yellow, red or brown. Adults are around 5mm long.

Bedbugs can hide in many places, including on bed frames, mattresses, clothing, furniture, behind pictures and under loose wallpaper.

Signs of bedbugs include:

- bites often on skin exposed while sleeping, like the face, neck and arms
- spots of blood on your bedding from the bites or from squashing a bedbug
- small brown spots on bedding or furniture (bedbug poo)

Bedbugs can be dark yellow, red or brown. Adults are around 5mm long.



Bedbug bites can be raised and itchy. They're often in a line or grouped together. On white skin, bedbug bites usually look red. On black or brown skin, they may look purple and may be harder to see.

Some people have a reaction to the bites. They can be very itchy and there may be painful swelling. A severe allergic reaction (anaphylaxis) is also possible but rare.

### How you can treat bedbug bites:

Bedbug bites usually clear up on their own in a week or so.

Things you can do include:

- putting something cool, like a clean, damp cloth, on the affected area to help with the itching and any swelling
- keeping the affected area clean
- not scratching the bites to avoid getting an infection

A pharmacist can help with bedbug bites. You can ask a pharmacist about:

mild steroid cream like hydrocortisone cream to ease bedbug bites (children under 10 and pregnant women should get advice from a doctor before using hydrocortisone cream)

antihistamines - these may help if the bites are very itchy and you're unable to sleep

### See a GP if:

- bedbug bites are still very painful, swollen or itchy after trying treatments from a pharmacist
- the pain or swelling around the bites is spreading

You may have an infection and need treatment with antibiotics.

### How to get rid of bedbugs

If you think you have bedbugs, you should contact your local council or pest control service. It's very difficult to get rid of bedbugs yourself because they can be hard to find and may be resistant to some insecticides. There are some things you can try yourself, but these are unlikely to get rid of bedbugs completely.

### DO:


- wash affected bedding and clothing on a hot wash (60C) and tumble dry on a hot setting for at least 30 minutes
- put affected clothing and bedding in a plastic bag and put it in the freezer for 3 or 4 days
- clean and vacuum regularly bedbugs are found in both clean and dirty places, but regular cleaning will help you spot them early

### DON'T


- keep clutter around your bed
- bring second hand furniture indoors without carefully checking it first
- take luggage or clothing indoors without checking it carefully if you have come from somewhere where you know there were bedbugs



### FIXED PENALTY NOTICE ADVICE TO PARENTS

There is a very clear and demonstrable link between good attendance at school and good educational outcomes. Also, when a child is absent or late to school, this causes disruption to the rest of the class and causes your child to fall behind. To ensure that our pupils attend school every day, I am writing to you to let you know that we are working in partnership with Haringey Council, who will be issuing Fixed Penalty Notices to parents whose children are absent from school for unauthorised reasons.

It is a parent's responsibility to ensure that their children receive a full-time education. This is stated in Section 7 of the 1996 Education Act:

"The parent of every child of compulsory school age shall cause him to receive efficient full-time education suitable to his age, ability and aptitude, and to any special educational needs he may have, either by regular attendance at school or otherwise".

Regular attendance has been defined in law as meaning that a child must attend school every day. Unless your child cannot attend school due to an unavoidable cause or is too unwell to come to school, we expect your child to attend school every day, on time, on days when the school is open.

Schools can only authorise a pupil's absence in exceptional circumstances, and being absent from school due to a family holiday will not be considered as an exceptional circumstance. We understand that family circumstances differ however, and we will consider every request for leave when the school is open on an individual basis. Please put your request in writing and address it to the Head Teacher for consideration. Further details are available from the school office.

All headteachers must follow Department for Education guidance in relation to taking leave when schools are open, but it is the headteacher's decision whether to accept any parental explanation for absence, and to mark an absence as authorised or unauthorised in registers. Please be aware that pupils arriving to school after the official close of registers will be marked as being 'unauthorised absent' unless there are legitimate reasons for your child's late arrival.

















Should your child be absent for unauthorised reasons, you may be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice by Haringey Council. This is a penalty of £120, payable for each of your children that have been absent from school for unauthorised reasons. The penalty is payable by each parent. This means that both you and your partner will have to pay the penalty. If the penalty notice is paid within 21 days, there is a 50% discount, so the amount payable is £60 per penalty notice. Late or part payments are not accepted.

Every day in school counts towards your child's future, and I thank you in advance for supporting us in ensuring excellent school attendance.

This letter acts as a warning that any unauthorised absence may result in a penalty notice being issued to you.

If you are not able to apply online, please contact school admissions to request a paper form. However, there must be a legitimate reason for you not applying online. This form must reach the school admission team by 15/01/2024.


If you feel you would benefit from having a Language Champion to help improve your communication with school, please do get in touch via the school office.
