**Happy New School Year!** 



Welcome back to a new school year at Lancs. We start the year with optimism and excitement, with a fantastic staff team in place to welcome the children back to their learning and a great Ofsted outcome finally under our belt (after an extraordinarily long wait!). I hope you all had a lovely summer with your children and they are feeling refreshed and ready to return to school.

Through our annual school self-evaluation on July 2023, we have identified the following current key strengths and 6 priorities for development which we will be focusing on this year:

#### **KEY STRENGTHS**

- 1. Progress is strong in early years from often low starting points due to effective curriculum intent and implementation, with a rich and purposeful learning environment.
- 2. Greater depth attainment is strong.
- 3. Children with special needs and English as an additional language are viewed as high priorities at the school as reflected in the leadership and support staffing structures and the early identification of needs.
- 4. The school has a strong approach for the identification of and support for neurodiverse children whose needs are often hidden.
- 5. The school provides an ambitious, inclusive and well-planned broad and balanced curriculum with strong cross-curricular links supported by leaders who are experts in their areas.
- 6. Close attention to children's social and emotional needs and well-being is embedded within the school culture, led by a strong pastoral care team and supported by a range of initiatives.
- 7. Behaviour for learning is excellent, underpinned by a values-based approach; expectations are high and these are met.
- 8. The school has a clear vision and embedded set of values which are known and understood by all, have a positive impact on the school community and support improving outcomes for children; staff report that they are fully on board with the direction the school is taking.

- 9. Middle leaders are the engine room of school improvement, providing direction, expertise, guidance and support in their areas and staff report they are approachable.
- 10. The school's financial resources are well managed in the extremely challenging circumstances of low pupil numbers in Haringey and especially the local ward; a realistic 5-Year Deficit Plan is in place and has been ratified by governors and the local authority.

#### KEY PRIORITIES FOR DEVELOPMENT

- 1. Close gaps to national in all key stage 2 outcomes ensuring, in particular, that reading provision is maximising pupil progress.
- 2. Prioritise the development of cultural capital, particularly enhancing the curriculum through increasing trips, fieldwork and visitors.
- 3. Ensure consistency of lesson implementation including careful choosing of activities, effective checking of understanding and consistent teaching of key vocabulary.
- 4. Further enable teaching support staff to implement a consistently inclusive and understanding approach to behaviour, including during break and lunchtimes.
- 5. Urgently reduce persistent absenteeism.
- 6. Ensure progress against the 5-Year Deficit Recovery Plan is systematically tracked and innovative corrective action is taken when necessary.

We look forward to working with you on these, following our values of inclusion, lifelong learning, growth mindset, integrity, high aspirations and respect to help us achieve our vision of 'making the best school'.

#### Overall Effectiveness - GOOD

I could not be prouder about the report's opening paragraph, which captures the inclusivity that is at the heart of our school vision: "Pupils here belong to a caring and inclusive school. They show respect and kindness towards each other and build positive, trusting relationships with staff. Leaders have established a set of values that are central to the life of the school. Pupils reflect these values in all that they do. Pupils enjoy coming to school. They are happy here."


Unfortunately, in spite of achieving OUTSTANDING in 4 out of 5 areas of the inspection, the 'Overall Effectiveness' grade cannot be higher than the 'Quality of Education' grade, and is therefore limited at GOOD.

However, this is a huge achievement for the school. Parents/carers, governors, staff and children should all be very proud of the role that each of us has played in bringing the school to where it is today.

Persistent absence could lead to intervention from Haringey Education Welfare Service.


Please remember to contact school **each day** that your child is absent from school to let us know the reason for their absence.

## **Punctuality**


Every minute counts. Please try to help your children arrive to school on time everyday.

# **Online Safety**



There is currently an Online Harms bill going through Parliament, with urgent calls for the internet to be made safer for children – the NSPCC calls the internet the Wild West

You tube and Tik Tok is the daily diet for many children but managing screentime on these platforms is challenging because of the addictive design features. Extremely dangerous content can be easily accessed, with violent and scary video content masked by Early Years friendly titles such as Huggy Wuggy. Just like a Healthy Diet, at Lancasterian Primary School we promote a Digital Diet - "Not No tech but good tech."

Until the Online Harms bill is passed, parents need to stay very involved with their child's life Online, just as we do with young children learning to swim or cross the road.

Along with parental controls, parents and carers can stay actively involved the child's online world – helping choose safe child age apps and sites, playing online games with them, having regular conversations and setting firm boundaries (e.g. Gaming weekends and Books at Bedtime), as well as physically checking devices regularly.

#### **Child COVID Guidelines**

Children who have a high temperature must not attend the education or childcare setting until they no longer have a high temperature and are well enough to attend. Children with a positive COVID-19 test result must stay at home for 3 days after the day they have taken their test and can then return to school as long as they no longer have a high temperature and are well enough to attend. They do not need to have a negative test result

#### Polio

As some of you may have seen in the news, traces of polio virus have been detected in sewage samples in London. The overall risk to the public from polio remains low. However, given that the sewage findings suggest that polio may be spreading in the community, NHS England has issued new guidance to give children extra protection from poliovirus and to limit the spread. Therefore, all children aged 1 to 9 in London are being offered a vaccination dose against polio. For some children this will be an additional (booster) dose of the vaccine, while some will receive a vaccination to bring them up to date with their routine childhood vaccination schedule. You will be contacted by the NHS or your local GP to book a vaccination appointment for your child. There is also a walk-in service available for children aged 6-9 years who are up to date with their routine childhood vaccinations. This is held at Hornsey Central Vaccination Centre, 151 Park Road, N8 8JD, which is open seven days a week, from 3pm to 8pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 8pm on Saturdays and Sundays.
