
Her insights and support will be greatly missed – best of luck with your new life outside London, Kerry and family!

On the last week of half term we are having a dinosaur week in the early years (nursery and reception).


On Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October – we will have an 'learning dinosaur' dress-up day for children and staff at the school.

If your child requires a device to complete this work then please let the school know and we will provide one.

#### **Coronavirus 10 Day Isolation Reminder**

Please remember that if your child tests positive for Coronavirus then they must isolate at home for at least 10 days from the onset of their symptoms and then return to school only if they do not have symptoms other than cough or loss of sense of smell/taste.

The 10 day period starts from the day when they first became ill. If they still have a high temperature, they should keep self-isolating until their temperature returns to normal.

If your child has symptoms of Coronavirus (cough, temperature or change in sense of taste/smell) but you choose <u>not</u> to take them for a test, then the same 10 day isolation period from when they first had symptoms applies.

Please let's work together to keep infection rates in the school to an absolute minimum.
